LAST Night the Body of her late Royal Highness Princess Amelia-Sophia-Eleonora was privately interred in the Royal Vault in King Henry the Seventh's Chapel at Westminster, the Body having been privately conveyed to the Prince's Chamber the Night before.

About Half an Hour after Eight o'Clock, the Procession began to move, passing through the Old Palace Yard to the South-East Door of the Abbey, upon a Floor railed in, covered with Black Cloth, and under an Awning, and lined on each Side with a Party of the Foot-Guards, in the following Order.
