PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thurfday the Fourteenth Day

of this inflant December: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid Fourteenth Day of this instant December, to Tuesday the Twenty-third Day of January next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Twenty-third Day of January next, be held for the Difpatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgefles, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the faid Twenty-third Day of January next.
