HIS Day the Right Honourable John Hely Hutchinfon, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State in Ireland, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

The King has been pleafed, in Compliance with the With of his Serene Highness Godefroy Charles Henry De la Tour D'Auvergne, Reigning Duke de Bouillon, to order a Testimonial, under the Hand and Seal of his Serene Highness, recognizing, that Charles D'Auvergne, Esq; and James D'Auvergne, his Brother, Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, are descended from the Noble and Ancient Comtes D'Auvergne, from whom his Serene Highness also derives his Descent, to be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms; and likewife to confirm to them the faid Charles and James D'Auvergne and their Descendants, the Armorial Ensigns of the Family of D'Auvergne, the fame being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office.

A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow-ing Abstracts of Alls of Parliament of their lase Majesties, King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majefty, for preventing fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them .- And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or instrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or

73d (Highland) Regiment Adutant John Armstrong, in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers ibemjelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker. Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majetty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Consul of Great Briain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-laid; fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before. fome other Juffice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed. in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and shall be convicted upon In-dictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Beach at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted thall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit F1VE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Ession, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in some of His Majefty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools so feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder ; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the

Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefly, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE-HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefly.

under His Majelly. If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefly.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Press, Paper, Utensil or Implement whatsoever used in, or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of such Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Persons receiving or being in Posselion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-house Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Case of Tools and Utensils used in the Woollen and Sijk Manufactures.
