An Imperial Edict was issued here on the 11th ult. repealing all Edicts, Ordinances and Regulations concerning the Corn Trade in these Provinces; and declaring that henceforward every one shall be at Liberty to export or import all Kinds of Grain and Meal, without being subjected to the Inspection of the Police, or any other Restriction or Formality whatever, except the Payment of the Duties hitherto paid on the Exportation or Importation of those Articles.
