## Drefden, December 20.

An infectious Diftemper has broken out among the Horned Cattle at the Village of Stolpen, and in its Neighbourhood, at the Diffance of about Four German Miles Eastward from Drefden, which is fuppoled to have been brought thither by some Oxen lately imported from Poland. The Progress of the Diftemper has been rapid; but as a Cordon is now formed round the Villages where it has made its Appearance, and every other Precaution taken, it is hoped that it will be prevented from fpreading into the neighbouring Country.

# Stockholm, December 12.

On Account of the great Scarcity of Corn here, a Stop has been put to the Sale and Diftilling of Brandy, allowing however a certain Quantity for Family Confumption, to be had at the Magazines of the Crown, for which Certificates are to be granted.

His Swedish Majesty left Upfala on Saturday last, and arrived in this Capital the same Day, with the Prince Royal, to relide here during the Reft of the Winter. The next Day the Nobility and Foreign Ministers had the Honour of paying their Court to their Majesties, when the King appeared with the Orders of Russia, in Honour of St. Andrew's Day.

# Stockbolm, December 19.

' Monf. de Juel, the Danish Minister, died here on the 14th Instant.

The King of Pruffia has appointed Count Lepell to be his Minister at this Court, and he is expected here next Spring.

On Account of the Frost setting in so very early this Year, it was apprehended that the Herring Fishery would entirely fail. However, after the late Thaw, the Fith appeared on the Coast of Marstrand, though not in any confiderable Numbers.

Florence, December 16. The Great Duke of Tufcany has just issued a new Code of Criminal Laws, which is ordered to be ob-ferved in all his Dominions. It confifts of 119 Articles, by which capital Punifhments are abolifhed, as having been found to leave too flight an Impref-fion on the Minds of the People for the Prevention of Crimes, and more visible and permanent Sufferings ordained in their Stead. Torture is prohibited. Confications are declared unjust, as involving the innocent with the guilty. Proportionable Penalties are inflicted for flight Offences, and a more equitable Mode of Trial is established, particularly with regard to Evidence.

Soon after the Publication of this new Code, a Man condemned to the Gallies for a most inhuman Murder endeavoured to perfuade the Companion to whom he was chained, to escape with him ; but upon his Refulal, he took an Opportunity of picking up a large Stone, with which, notwithstanding his Chains, he massached his Companion, in the Presence of the Guard. So horrible a Deed, under fuch Circumstances, almost overcame the Great Duke's humane Temper. 'He immediately ordered a Gallows to be erected in the most public Part of Pifa; but his Imperial Highnels countermanded the Order for his Execution, and the Criminal was fentenced to a more; excruciating and lafting Punifhment, that of being immured between four Walls, where, almost unable to move, he must end his Life in the utmost Mifery. As a more flagrant Offence can fcarcely be committed, Punishments by Death are not expected to be revived in this Country.

## 2.2 Vienna, December 30.

The late Partition of the Kingdom of Hungary into Ten Jarge Districts, with only the same Number of Courts of Judicature, having been found insufficient for the fpeedy Distribution of Justice among the lower Classes of People, his Imperial Majefty has etta-blifted, in each of the Thirty-eight Counties of that Kingdom, an inferior Tribunal for the Decifion of

all Caufes between Individuals in the first Instance. As these Tribunals are constituted on a much more liberal and folid Footing than formerly, the most faturary Effects may be expected from them.
