N Thursday last One of the King's Messengers, dispatched by the Right Honourable William Eden, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of France, arrived at the Office of the Marquis of Carmarthen, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with the Most Christian King's Ratification of the Convention, figned the 15th of January last, concerning the Execution of the Treaty of Navigation and Commerce lately concluded between His Majesty and the Most Christian King, which was exchanged with Mr. Eden against His Majesty's Ratification, on the 29th of January last, at Verfailles, by his Most Christian Majesty's Plenipotentiary.
