'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this Day read at the Board, the humble Petition of several Merchants of London, in Behalf of themselves and others trading to Spain, humbly praying, for the Reasons therein contained, that all Ships coming from the Ports of Spain within the Mediterranean, laden with Fruit, Wine, and other Goods not enumerated in the Quarantine Regulations, may, on the same being verified to the Officers of the Cuftoms at the Ports where fuch Ships may arrive, be freely admitted to Entry without performing Quarantine: His Majesty having taken the faid Petition into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Obstructions upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Health and Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from or through the Mediterranean be taken off, so far as respects Ships and Vessels coming directly from any of the Ports of the King-dom of Spain, within the Mediterranean, or from the Island of Minorca, laden with the Products of Spain only; and that all such Ships, and also all Ships and Vessels arriving from the Town or Port of Gibraltar, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine: Provided that the Cargo on board fuch Ships shall consist entirely of Articles not enumerated in the Orders of Council directing the Performance of Quarantine, except any Bags, Straw, Matting or Platting on Jars, which shall have been solely made Use of as Package for the said non-enumerated Articles: And provided also that they bring with them Clean Bills of Health, and that the Master or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Answer, upon Gath, before the Superintendant of Quarantine, or other Person appointed for that Service, to the printed Questions usually put to the Masters of Ships coming from Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, and that by the faid Answers, which shall be transmitted by the said Superintendant or other Person appointed to see Quarantine performed, to the Principal Officers of the Customs, or to the Chief. Magistrate at the Place to which the Ship is bound, it shall appear, to the Satisfaction of the said Principal Officers or Chief Magistrate, that such Ship did not touch at any infected Place, nor had Com-munication with any infected Ship or Vessel, during the Voyage, and that the Crew is free from Infection. -And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's

Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Madrid, January 29.

Mr. Liston, His Britannick Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at this Court, having, in purfuance of his Instructions, made Application for a Prolongation of the Term of Six Months, fixed by the late Convention for the Evacuation of the Mosquito Country, which would expire on the last Day of February, his Catholick Majesty has consented to prolong the Time specified for Four Months. The End of June next is therefore agreed upon by the Two Courts to be the Time fixed for the faid Evacuation being compleated, and Orders are accordingly

fent from hence to the President of Guatemala, and the Commandant of Truxillo, to conduct themselves in Conformity to this Arrangement.

Constantinople, January 11.

The Plague has again broken out, with a Violence altogether unusual in this Season of the Year, in different Parts of Conkantinople, and in the Suburb of Haskoy, mostly inhabited by Jews, in the Neighbourhood of the Naval Arsenal. It is hoped, however, that the present very cold Weather may check the Progress of the Contagion.
