fent from hence to the Prefident of Guatemala, and the Commandant of Truxillo, to conduct themfelves in Conformity to this Arrangement.

Constantinople, January 11.

The Plague has again broken out, with a Violence altogether unufual in this Seafon of the Year, in different Parts of Conkantinople, and in the Suburb of Hafkoy, moftly inhabited by Jews, in the Neighbourhood of the Naval Arfenal. It is hoped, how-ever, that the prefent very cold Weather may check the Progress of the Contagion.

St. Petersburgh, January 19.

Her Imperial Majesty, with her Suite, set off Yesterday Morning at about Nine o'Clock from Czarfco-Zelo, on her intended Tour. The Treaty of Commerce between this Court and

that of Naples was figned at Czarsco-Zelo by the respective Plenipotentiaries Yesterday Evening,

Dresden, January 21.

The Diftemper, which had broken out among the Horned Cattle in the Village and Neighbourhood of Stolpen, has entirely difappeared; in Confequence of which the Troops, which were stationed to prevent the fpreading of the Infection, have been withdrawn.

Nice, January 25.

Yefterday died here John Birkbeck, Elq; His Britannick Majefty's Conful.

Turin, January 30.

His Sardinian Majesty has appointed the Count de St. André, Commandant at Nice, to be Viceroy of Sardinia.
