THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to render more effectual the Laws now in Being for suppressing unlawful Lotteries.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act to enable His Majesty to establish a Court of Criminal Judicature on the Eastern Coasts of New South Wales, and the Parts adjacent.

And to One Private Bill.

Letters were received here Yesterday, mentioning the Arrival of the Empress at Smolensko on the 23d Instant, and that her Imperial Majesty had enjoyed a perfectly good State of Health during her Journey from Czarico-Zelo to that City.
