HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Uther of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by wirtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Asses agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Assent to hear the Commission and the House of Peers, to bear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and feveral other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to
