**T**HE King has been pleased to grant to the Honourable John Luttrell, of New Hall in the County of Essex, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and take the Surname and Arms of Olmius, as a Mark of Respect to the Memory of his Father-in-Law, the Right Honourable John, Olmius, Baron Waltham, of Phillips Town in the Kingdom of Ireland, late of Patishwick Hall and Braintree, in the said County of Essex, deceased, with whose only Daughter Elizabeth the said John Luttrell some Time since intermarried; such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and His Majesty has also been pleased to order that this His Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

This Day came on at the Palace of Holyrood House, in consequence of His Majesty's Proclamation, the Election of Two Peers of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of the present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of William Duke of Queensberry, and James Earl of Abercorn, created Peers of Great Britain, when Dunbar Earl of Selkirk, and George Lord Kinnaird, were elected.
