Navy-Office, April 9, 1787.

MONEY being in the Hands of the Treasurer of the Navy to pay the Bounty for the Year 1786, to such Chaplains in the Royal Navy as appear by the Books of His Majesty's Ships to have been actually borne and mustered for the Space of Four Years, during the Wars before the last with France and Spain; also to such Chaplains as have, in the like Manner, been actually borne and mustered for the Space of Four Years during the late Hostilities with the United States of America, France, Spain, and the States General of the United Provinces, and who have been entered on the List by virtue of the Documents which they have respectively transmitted to this Office, in consequence of the Advertisement of the 19th of January, 1785;

Notice is hereby given, that the same will be paid at the Pay-Office in Broad-street, on Monday the 16th Instant, to such Persons as are entitled thereto by Act of Parliament.

The Payment having been delayed for Want of the usual Affidavits of those entitled being received in proper Time, it is hereby desired that in future they will transmit them to this Office within one Month after the 31st Day of December in every Year, otherwise they will be deprived of the Benefit of the first Class.

Gibraltar Prize Money.

AN Act passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to explain, amend, and render more effectual an Act passed in the Twenty-third, intituled, An Act for authorizing the Treasurer of the Navy to pay the Garrison and Naval Department at Gibraltar the like Bounty for destroying certain Spanish Ships of War as is allowed to the Officers and Men on board any of His Majesty's Ships of War taking or destroying Ships of War belonging to the Enemy;

The Commissioners appointed by virtue of the said Act to inspect, examine and settle all Accounts of such Bounty Money and Prize Money, do hereby give Notice to all Persons claiming Shares of the said Prize Money, That all Claims respecting the same must, and they are hereby required to be delivered into the Board on or before the 1st Day of January, 1788, otherwise they will be excluded from the Benefit of the said Act; and they further give Notice to all Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and private Soldiers who served in the Garrison of Gibraltar at the Time the Spanish Floating Batteries were destroyed, and the St. Miguel Ship of War, taken, who have not received any Share of the Prize Money on Account of their Names being left out of the Prize Lists, to apply at the Office for examining Army Accounts, Dorset-court, Westminster, by Letter or otherwise, and state their Pretensions, in order to their being laid before the Commissioners for their Consideration, on or before the said 1st Day of January, 1788.
