Gibraltar Prize Money.

AN Act paffed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His pre-A fent Majefty's Reign, to explain, amend, and ren-der more effectual an Act paffed in the Towenty-third, intituled, An Act for authorizing the Treasurer of the Navy to pay the Garrison and Naval Department at
