Whitehall, April 24.

THE King has been pleased to grant to John Ogle Williamfon, of Bridlington Key, in the County of York, Gentleman, His Royal Licence and Authority to take upon himself and use the Surname of Ogle only, pursuant to the last Will of John Ogle, late of the City of York, Esq; deceased; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Genoa, April 9.

The Magistrate of Health here has received authentic Advice of the Plague raging at Algiers, and that about Sixty Persons die there daily.

Vienna, April 11.

The Emperor set out this Morning, at Five o'Clock, for Lemberg, where it is supposed he will arrive about the 20th Instant. Count Philip Kinsky is the only Gentleman who has the Honour of accompanying His Imperial Majesty in this Journey.

Count Walmoden, His Britannick Majesty's Electoral Minister at this Court, had his Audience of Leave, and presented to the Emperor his-Recredential Letters, on Sunday last.

Munich, April 15.

The Elector Palatine has held a Chapter of the Order of St. Hubert, in which Prince Nicholas Charles de Radzivil, Prince Mathias Sablonowki, Prince Lewis Aloysius Hohenlohe Bartenstein, Prince Maximilian of Tour and Taxis, Prince Charles Joseph of Palm, Frederick Egon Landgrave of Furstemberg, and Charles Baron of Venningen, were invested with that Order.
