Mons. de Brienne, Archbishop of Toulouse, is appointed President of the Royal Council of Finances, and has taken his Seat in Council as Minister of State. Monf. de Villedeuil succeeds Monf. de Fourqueux, as Comptroller-General; and Messrs. de Lessart, Dessorges, Lambert, and de la Malliere, are appointed Intendants of the Finances.
