Ghent, to fell there. From Brebant we have an account, that on Friday last the Prince went from his quarter at Hoboken, to Dendermonde, to view that place; that in his return, the Forerunners having difcovered 500 French Horfe to lie in Ambuscade, upon the notice they had of his Highneffes being gone to Dendermonde; that the Convoy that was with his Highness fell upon them, routed them, and brought about 40 Horfes, which they had taken into their quartćt.

Brassels, March 22.
