General Post-Office, May 16, 1787.

**T**HE Post-Boy carrying the Mail from Haslemere to this Office last Night, was stopped on Milsford-Heath, within Four Miles of Godalmin, about a Quarter before Ten o'Clock, by a tall Man on Foot, dressed in a White round Frock, who, with a naked Knife, demanded and took the Mail, and ordered the Boy to ride on to Godalmin. The Mail containing the following Bags of Letters for London, viz:

Petworth,	Shoreham.
