" Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday;" and alfo an Acl of Parliament made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of the late King William the Third, intitled, "An Act for the more effectual fupprefling of Blaf-"phemy and Profanencis;" and also an Act pafied in the Twenty-first Year of Our Reign, initided, " An Act for preventing certain Abufes and Profana-" tions on the Lord's Day, called Sunday," and all other Laws now in Force for the punishing and fuppreffing any of the Vices aforefaid; and also to supprefs and prevent all Gaming whatfoever in Publick or Private Houfes on the Lord's Day; and likewife that they take effectual Care to prevent all Perfons keeping Taverns, Chocolate-Houfes, Coffee-Houfes, or other Publick-Houses whatsoever, from felling Wine, Chocolate, Coffee, Ale, Beer, or other Liquors, or receiving or permitting Guefts to be or remain in fuch their Houfes, in the Time of Divine Service on the Lord's Day, as they will answer it to Almighty God, and upon Pain of Our higheft Difpleasure. And for the more effectual proceeding herein, We do hereby direct and command all Our And for the more effectual proceeding Judges of Affize, and Juffices of the Peace, to give ftrict Charge, at their respective Affizes and Seffions, for the due Profecution and Punishment of all Perfons that shall prefume to offend in any of the Kinds aforefaid, and alfo of all Perfons that, contrary to their Duty, shall be remiss or negligent in putting the faid Laws in Execution; and that they do, at their re-spective Affizes and Quarter Sessions of the Peace, caufe this Our Royal Proclamation to be publickly read in open Court immediately before the Charge is given. And We do hereby further charge and command every Minister, in his respective Parish Church or Chapel, to read, or cause to be read, this Our Proclamation, at least Four Times in every Year, immediately after Divine Service; and to incite and stir up their respective Auditors to the Practice of Piety and Virtue, and the avoiding of all Immorality and Profanenels. And to the End that all Vice and Debauchery may be prevented, and Religion and Virtue practifed by all Officers, Private Soldiers, Mariners and others, who are employed in Our Service by Sea and Land, We do hereby firicily charge and command all Our Commanders and Officers whatfoever, that they do take Care to avoid all Profaneness, Debauchery and other Immoralities, and that, by their own good and virtuous Lives and Conversation, they do set good Examples to all fuch as are under their Care and Authority, and likewife take Care of and infpect the Behaviour of all fuch as are under them, and pu-nifh all those who shall be guilty of any of the Offences aforefaid, as they will be answerable for the ill Confequences of their Neglect herein.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the First Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-feven, in the Twenty-feventh Year of Our Reign.

His Pruffian Majefty has conflituted a Supreme Council of War, of which his Serene Highnels the Duke of Brunswick is appointed Prefident in Chief; General Mcellendorff, Vice-Prefident in Chief; Lieutenant-General Rohdich, Prefident, and Firft Minister of War; and Major-General Kaunewurff, Vice-Prefident.

The King has just iffued Orders for the entire Abolition of the Tax on Rye, and for reducing the Transit Duties on Russian Products transported down the Oder and the Elbe, from Five and Eight, to Two and Three per Cent. respectively.
