FIRST Troop of Horse Guards, Cornet Major John Drouly is appointed to be Second Lieutenant and Lieutenant-Colonel, vice William Calderwood.

Ditto, Guidon and Major Henry Read to be Cornet and Major, vice John Drouly.

Ditto, Exempt and Captain Thomas Roberts to be Guidon and Major, vice Henry Read.

Ditto, Brigadier and Lieutenant Sherborne Stewart to be Exempt and Captain, vice Thomas Roberts.

Ditto, Sub-Brigadier and Cornet Thomas Squire to be Brigadier and Lieutenant, vice Sherborne Stewart.

The last Letters from Aleppo, dated the 31st ult. advise that the Plague raged there with such Violence as to carry off from a Thousand to Fifteen Hundred Persons daily. This Place happily continues free from the Contagion.

His Excellency John Charles Pallavicino having finished the Term of Two Years, as Doge of the Republick, Mr. Raphael de Ferrari, with the usual Formalities, was elected the 4th Instant to succeed him.

Brussels, July 20.

Their Royal Highnesses the Arch Dutechs and Duke of Saxe-Teschen set off Yesterday Morning for Vienna, and this Day Count de Belgioioso set out for the same Place.

Previous to the Departure of their Royal Highnesses, a Deputation of the General Assembly of the States waited upon them, to acquaint them that they had resolved to send up Deputies from each Province to Vienna.

The Government of these Provinces devolves in the mean Time on General Murray.
