**O**N Thursday last, between Twelve and One o'Clock, His Royal Highness the Duke of York arrived from Germany, and soon after set out for Windsor.

*Whitehall, August 2.*

The King has been pleased to grant unto John Baldwin, of Harrock Hall, Clerk, Rector of North Meals, both in the County Palatine of Lancaster, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and take the Surname and bear the Arms of Rigbye only, (such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office,) pursuant to the last Will and Testament of Thomas Rigbye, late of Harrock Hall, within Wrightington, in the said County Palatine of Lancaster, Esq; deceased; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint George Hardinge, Esq; one of His Majesty's Council learned in the Law, to be His Majesty's Justice of the Counties of Glamorgan, Brecon and Radnor, within the Principality of Wales.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Lord Hervey to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Great Duke of Tuscany.
