noured Count Momercuculi with a new Title, wiz, that of Duke d'Amalfi. From Upper Hungary we have Advice, that feveral Troops, raifed in Poland, were arrived there, to affift the Rebels, which we are unwilling to give credit to.

Copenbagen, April 5. It is faid here in Town, that the Suedes have made an Attack upon Helmstadt, but that they were repulled with the loss of 2000 Men. which needs a confirmation. On Saturday laft Major General Baudiffen arrived here from Holffein, and Major General Degenfelt from Norway, by water. We continue our preparations here for the approaching Campagac-with all pollible application.

Hamburgh, April 8. Count Coningfmarke is return-the with his Troops to Straellord, and his Cavalry, for their better lubilitence, is palt over into the file fit Rugen. The lunenburg Troops had their quarters the 6th inftant near Malchun, and the next day mar-The Lunenburg Troops had their quarters ched from thence to Demmin; it is faid the Brandenburghs will join them in few dayes, and that then they will march directly to Straellond, to ndeavor to force the Suedes from thence. These at prefent fortifie Demgarten.

Strasburgh, April z. Six thouland French are dails at work on the Fortifications of Friburg, which are at prefent very near finished; the place is provided with a good Garilon with Provisions, and all things neceffary, On Sunday last two Battalions of Piedmont and Daufine came to Friburg, the next day a Party of 160 Imperial Horse, and 30 Croats, met 8 Companies of Turenne, with a Convoy of 100 Horfe, marching likewile thither; the French Horfe prefently gave ground, and left the Foot to shift for themselves, of which many were killed. The Imperialifts took a Captain of Horle, and fome others Prifoners. We are told, that all the French Troops which have had their quarters in Burgundy , are coming into these Parts, as allo a confiderable Detachment from Flanders.

Francfort, April 6. Here are feveral Imperial Officers in Town, who tell us, that their Troops are marching to their general Rendezvous, affigned near Wormes, the 15th of this month ; that the Duke of Lorrain will be there by that time; that General Cobs, who is to have the first Command under the Duke, is at Wormes already, to give the neceffary Orders; and that the Emperors Army this Campagne will be compoled of near 40 000 Men.

Cologne, April 8. The Bishop of Gurck, the Em. perors Ambassador and Plenipotentiary for the Treaty at Nimeguen, continues still here, in order to the disposing of matters in favor of the Duke of Neuburg's Son, who pretends to the Coadjutorship of this See. The Duke and Dutchess of Neuburg are preparing for their journey to Vienna, though it's faid that the Duke may continue fome time at Neuburg, whil'if the Dutcheis goes on to Vienna, to be prefent at the lying in of the Empressher daughter, which, we are told, is expected about the latter end of the next month

_ Hague, April 12. The States of Holland are leparated fon 14 dayes, having before palt a Refolution, for the railing the 200th Peny before the first of Fune. The Deputies of the respective Admiralties have had feveral Conferences concerning the Equipage defigned for the North-Sea; and though we do not learn that any final Refolution has been taken therein, yet it is faid, that it is intended to conful of 38 Men of War, all mounted between 50 and 40

Guns. We do not as yet hear any thing of the Squadron defigned for the Baltick. The Letters we have from the Army are of the 10th inftant, then his Highnels continued his quarters at Boom, between Antwerp and Mechelen, without any likelihood of removing very fuddenly from thence. His Highnefs had given Orders to have all his Regiments complete by the first of May, about the middle of which mouth we are flill told, that the French will begin their fecond Campagne.

Bruges, April 9. Our Magistrates being extremely troubled for what had hapned to the English in the late Diforder here, have not only caufed 12 or 14. perfons, who were the chief Authors and Abettors of it, to be Apprehended, in bider to an exemplary Punifhment, but have made all the Reparation to the English, the thing is capable of: Those that were wounded, have had all care taken of them, in order to their Cure, and befides have had 30 Gilders given to each of them, with promile of allowing Penfions; or otherwise fatisfying the Wives and Children of those that were killed, if they have any. Nor have the Magilirates been wanting to express how fentible they are of what they owe to the prudent and difcreet Conduct of the Earl of Middleton, who commands the English here, on this occasion ; of which the Marquis d Offera having given the Duke de Villa Hermola, Governor of these Provinces, an account, his Excellency hath written a Letter to his Lordihip, to give him his Thanks, for having by his great care and prudence to much contributed towards the appealing this Diforder, which might otherwife have had fo ill confequences.
