A PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Scamen and Landmen to enter themfelves on Board His Majefly's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who shall voluntarily enter them-felves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Eifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of October next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendevous on Shore, for raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, ihall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man; and all fuch Able-Bedied Landmen, not -above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall fo enter themielves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of fuch Seamen and Landmen : And We do declare, that the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen fo entering themselves as aforefaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Malter, and Boatswain of the Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And for Prevention of any Abuses, by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on Board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to

theniselves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lofe the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfirst Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-feven, in the Twenty-fe-venth Year of Our Reign.

PROCLAMATION, A

For Recalling and Probibiting Seamen from ferving Foreign Princes and States, and for granting Re-avards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal themfelves.

GEORGE . R.

THEREAS We are informed, That great W Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby strictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Friots, Mariners, Seamen, Snipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever and wherefoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Vessel, That forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themselves, depart from, and quit such Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries. And farther, We do hereby frighty prohibit and forbid all Moltere We do hereby firstly prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever, (being our natu-ral-born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, of to fervice in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever. belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, in order to belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall ablent themsfelves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they shall belong, and shall enter in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obe-dience. dience.
