By the KING. PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Sixteenth Day of this instant October: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Sixteenth Day of this instant October, to Thursday the Fifteenth Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Fisteenth Day of November next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Fisteenth Day of November next. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fifth Day of October, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, in the Twenty-seventh Year of Our Reign.
