PROCLAMATION. Ά GEORGE R.

HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Sixteenth Day of this inflant October: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do

hereby publish and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid Sixteenth Day of this inftant October, to Thurfday the Fifteenth Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commiffion for proroguing the fame ac-cordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Fifteenth Day of November next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes, and the Commiffioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the faid Fifteenth Day of November next. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fifth Day of October, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-feven, in the Twenty-feventh Year of Our Reign.
