WHEREAS several Masters and Surgeons belonging to His Majesty's Navy have omitted to leave at this Office an Account of their Places of Abode, or have removed since having left such an Account; it is the Direction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, that all Masters and Surgeons, not at this Time employ'd in the Service, do forthwith give Notice here of their Place of Abode, and do continue to do the same as often as they shall remove to any other Place; and such as have had Leave to go Abroad in the Merchants Service, or otherwise, are to send an Account where they now are, and when the Voyage they are on will probably be terminated, observing, that upon their Arrival at any Port in Great Britain or Ireland, the Leave by which they are, at present absent is to cease and determine: And they are forthwith to send Notice of such Arrival to the said Commissioners.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy give Notice, That such Persons as are willing to serve in His Majesty's Ships, in the Capacity of Surgeons Mates, shall, upon their Application at this Office, have Letters for their being examined at Surgeons Hall, and, if found qualified, be immediately employed according to such Qualifications as shall be given from thence. They shall receive Two Months Advance in the Ships where they shall be appointed before they proceed to Sea.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Duties on Stamp'd Vellum, Parchment and Paper, duly authorized by the Lords, Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to an Act of the last Session of Parliament, to Let to Farm the Duties granted by "An Act of the Twenty-fifth of His present Majesty on Horses Let to Hire for Travelling Post, and by Time," do hereby give Notice, That they intend to Let, at their Office in Lincoln's-inn, the said Duties to Farm, on Wednesday the 24th Day of October next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, according to the Districts in the Statement under-mentioned, and to put the same up at the Sums placed opposite to each, for the Term of Three Years from the 1st Day of November next, to such Persons as may be willing to contract for the same.
