and command them, and every of them, from henceforth to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedience, and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, that the Offenders to the contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmail Severities of the Law. And We do hereby declare, that if any fach Mafters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects) (hall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of Great Britain. And we do hereby further promise and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhall be paid any Perfon who fhall different any Seaman or Seamen who may fecrete themfelves, to that fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for our faid Service by any of our Sea Officers employed for raifing Men; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo discovered and taken in and about London', by the principal Officers and Commiffioners of our Navy: And at the Out-ports by the Naval Officers (where there are any); and (where there are no Na-val Officers) by the Collectors of Our Cultoms, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to the faid principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors respectively, by the Perfon who may make Discovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in confe-quence of his Difcovery; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service.

A PROCLAMATION,

Respecting the GOLD COIN.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS it has been reprefented unto Us, that great Quantities of the Gold Coin of this Realm, deficient in Weight, are now in Circulation, contrary to the Tenour of Our Royal Proclamation of the TwelfthDay of April, One thouland feven hundred and feventy-fix, and there being Reafon to believe that due Attention is not paid to the weighing of the faid Gold Coin, and to the Directions given in the Acts of Parliament now in Force with Refpect to the cutting, breaking or defacing of fuch Pieces thereof as are found to be of lefs Weight than those declared and allowed by Our faid Proclamation to be current and pass in Payment; We do think proper, by this Our Royal Proclamation, to declare and command, in like

Manner as We did declare and command in Our before-mentioned Proclamation of the Twelfth Day of April, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-fix, That all Guineas, Half Guineas and Quarter Guineas, more deficient in Weight than the Rates specified in the Table following,

whatfoever: And We do hereby friftly require and command all Our loving Subjects, and particularly all the Officers, Collectors and Receivers of Our Revenues, flriftly to conform to the Orders hereby given, and to the Directions and Regulations enacted and eftablished in the feveral Acts of Parliament now in Force with Respect to the cutting, breaking and defacing fuch Pieces of the faid Gold Coin as shall be found deficient in Weight. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-first Day of September; One thouland feven hundred and eighty-feven, in the Twenty-feventh Year of Our Reign.

AA of the 14th Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign; " Chap. 70. SeA. 7.

ND be it further enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That the Tellers in the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer in Great Britain, and all Receivers, Collectors and other Officers of all His Majelty's Revenues wherefoever, and all other Perfons whatfoever, are hereby authorifed and re-quired to cut, break or deface, or caufe to be cut, broken or defaced, every Piece of Gold Coin of this Realm that fhall be tendered to them or any of them in Payment, after fuch Time and Times as any fuch Piece of Gold Coin fhall, by virtue of any Proclamation of His Majesty in Council, be declared not to be allowed' to pais in any Payment whatfoever, any Law or Statute to the contrary thereof in anywife notwithstanding; and the Perfon tendering the fame shall bear the Los: But if any fuch Piece fo cut, broken or defaced, fhall be of due Weight, and appear to be lawful Money, the Perfon that cut, broke or defaced the fame, shall and is hereby required to take and receive the fame at the Rate it was coined for : And if any Queffions or Difputes shall arife, whether the Piece fo cut be lawful Coin, within the Intent and Meaning of His Majesty's Proclamations, it shall be heard and finally determined by the Mayor, Bailiff or Bailiffs, or other Chief Officer of any City or Town Corporate where fuch Tender shall be made; and if fuch Tenders shall be made out of any City or Town Corporate, then by fome Juffice of the Peace of the County inhabiting or being near the Place wycre fuch Tender shall be made; and the faid Mayor or other Chief Officer, and Justice of the Peace, shall have full Power and Authority to administer an Oath, as he shall see convenient, to any Person, for determining any Questions relating to the Weight and lawful Currency of the faid Piece of Coin.
