HIS Morning one of His Majefty's Meffengers arrived at the Office of the Marquis of Carmarthen, His Majefty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with the Declaration and Counter Declaration, of which the following are Translations, which were refpectively figned and exchanged at Verfailles, on the 27th Inftant, by his Grace the Duke of Dorfet, His Majefty's Ambaffador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and the Right Ho-24 nourable William Eden, His Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary, on the Part of His Majesty, and by the Count de Montmorin, His Moft Chriftian Majesty's Minister and Secretary of State, having the Department of Foreign Affairs, on the Part of His Most Christian Majesty.

DECLARATION.

THE Events which have taken Place in the Republic of the United Provinces appearing no longer to leave any Subject of Difcuftion, and still less of Contest, between the two Courts, the Underfigned are authorized to ask, whether it is the Intention of His Most Christian Majesty to carry into Effect the No-tification made on the 16th of September last, by His Most Christian Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary, which, by announcing that Suc

cours would be given in Holland, has occafioned the Naval Armaments on the Part of His Majesty; which Armaments have become reciprocal.

If the Court of Verfailles is difpofed to explain itfelf on this Subject, and upon the Conduct to be adopted towards the Republic, in a Manner conformable to the Defire, which has been expressed on both Sides, to preferve the good Understanding between the two Courts; and it being alfo underflood, at the fame Time, that there is no View of Hostility towards any Quarter, in confequence of what has paffed; His Majefty, always anxious to concur in the friendly Sentiments of His Moft Chriftian Majefty, would agree with Him, that the Armaments, and in general all warlike Preparations, should be difcontinued on each Side, and that the Navi.s of the two Nations fhould be again placed upon the Footing of the Peace Establishment, as it stood on the First of January of the prefent Year.

THE Intention of His Majefty not being, and never having been, to interfere by Force in the Affairs of the Republic of the United Provinces, the Communication made to the Court of London, on the 16th of last Month, by Monf. His Majesty, therefore, being de-firous to concur with the Sentiments of His Britannick

Britannick Majefty for the Prefervation of the good Harmony between the two Courts, agrees with Pleafure, with His Britannick Majesty, that the Armaments, and in general all warlike Preparations, shall be difcontinued on each Side; and that the Navies of the two Nations shall be again placed upon the Footing of the Peace Eftablishment, as it stood on the First of January of the present Year.
