HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His VV Order in Council of the 26th of last Month, to circe, that the several Bounties therein mentioned should continue to be paid to every Able and Ordinary Seamen, and Able-Bodied Landman, who should, on or before the 31st Day of December next, voluntarily enter thersfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and allo that the Rewards therein mentioned ihould be paid to any Perfon who fhould, on or before the faid 31ft Day of December next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that to fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men :-His Majesty, judging it no longer neceffary to continue the Armament at Sea, is pleased, by and with the

forth ceafe, determine, and be no longer paid or payable, any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithftanding. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
