The Packets will leave at Barbadoes all Letters for the Leeward Islands, which will be conveyed by a Brig to Dominica, Amigua and St. Kitt's, where they will be delivered to the English Packets upon their Arrival from Grenada, and forwarded with the rest to Jamaica and England.
