THE King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Hereford to elect a Bishop of that See, void by the Death of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor James Beauclerk, (commonly called Lord James Beauclerk,) late Bishop thereof; and His Majesty has also been pleased, by His Royal Sign Manual, to recommend the Honourable and Reverend Doctor John Harley, Dean of His Majesty's Chapel Royal in the Castle of Windsor, to be by them chosen Bishop of that See.

The King has been pleased to present the Reverend John Barker, Doctor in Divinity, Master of Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, to the Living of the Rectory and Parish Church of Wadingham, St. Mary's and St. Peter's, with the Chapel of Smitterby, in the County and Diocese of Lincoln, void by the Death of the Reverend Robert Carter Thelwall.
