Copenhagen, October 30.

Yesterday, at Half past One o'Clock, the King of Sweden landed, from an open Boat, at the Custom-house Wharf of this City. His Majesty immediately went to General Sprengporten's House, and from thence to Court. In the Evening the King accompanied the Royal Family to the Play, and this Morning his Majesty had a Levee, at which the Principal Nobility and the Foreign Ministers had the Honour of being presented to him. His Swedish Majesty and all his Suite, which consists of Thirty-six Persons, are lodged at the Palace.
