*Admiralty-Office, November 17, 1787.*

**T**HE King having signified to my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty His Royal Pleasure that the Frock Uniform Cloathing, at present worn by the Flag Officers of His Majesty's Fleet, and the Uniform Cloathing now worn by the Captains, Masters and Commanders; Lieutenants, and Midshipmen of His Royal Navy, shall be altered in the Manner mentioned at the Foot hereof; and also that the Uniform Cloathing hereafter described shall be worn by the Warrant Officers and Masters Mates of His Royal Navy; their Lordships do hereby give Notice thereof to all Flag Officers, Captains, Masters and Commanders, Lieutenants, Warrant Officers, Masters Mates, and Midshipmen abovementioned, and require and direct them to conform strictly thereto.

Such Officers, however, as are provided with the Uniforms in present Use, are permitted to wear the same, if they think fit, until they have Occasion to make up new Suits of Cloaths.

Blue Coat, with Blue Lapels and Cuffs, Gold-Lace Holes, Three pointed at the End, with the same Distinction in the Disposition of them for the different Ranks as before; stand-up Collar, with One Hole on each Side, Three Holes on the Flap, Three on the outside Cuff, and Three behind; White Lining; new Anchor Button with Laurel, same as to the Full Dresf.

Blue Coat, with White Lapels and Cuffs, laced with Gold Lace, the Pockets double-laced, round Cuff with Two Laces; Three Buttons to the Pockets and Cuffs; Blue stand-up Collar double-laced, White Lining; new Buttons with the Anchor in an Oval:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## DITTO, Frocks.

Blue Cloth Coats, Blue Lapels and round Cuffs; fall-down Collar; Gold Lace Holes, square at both Ends, regular in the Lapels; Two to the Pocket, and Two to the Cuff, none behind; White Lining, Buttons same as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## CAPTAINS, under Three Years, Full Dresf.

Blue Coat, with White Lapels and Cuffs, laced with Gold Lace; the Pocket once laced; round Cuff with One Lace; Three Buttons to Pockets and Cuffs; Blue stand-up Collar double laced; White Lining, Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## DITTO, Frocks.

Blue Coat, Blue Lapels and ditto round Cuffs; fall-down Collar; Gold Lace Holes, square at both Ends, Nine Holes in the Lapels by Three's; Two to the Pockets, and Two to the Cuff, none behind; White Lining; Buttons same as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## MASTERS and COMMANDERS, Full Dresf.

Blue Cloth Coats, with Blue Lappels and ditto round Cuffs, laced with Gold-Lace; the Pocket once laced, and One on the Cuff; Three Buttons to each; stand-up Collar, double laced; White Lining; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## DITTO, Frocks.

Blue Cloth Coats, with Blue Lapels, round Cuffs, and fall-down Collar; Gold Lace Holes; square at each End, Ten in the Lappels, by Two's; Two to the Pocket, and Two on the Cuff; none behind; White Lining; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches, plain.

## LIEUTENANTS, Full Dresf.

Blue Cloth Coat, with White Lappels and ditto round Cuffs; Holes regular in the Lappels; Three Buttons to the Pocket, and Three on the Cuff; stand-up Collar; White Lining; Buttons same as the Captains:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

## Undresf.

Blue Cloth Coat, edged with White Cloth; Blue Lappels and ditto round Cuffs; Three Buttons to the Pockets and Cuffs; stand-up Collar; Buttons as above:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

## WARRANT OFFICERS.

Blue Cloth Coat, with Blue Lappels and ditto round Cuffs; fall-down Collar; Three Buttons to the Pocket and Cuff; White Lining, but not edged with White; Button with an Anchor, same as the Captains former one:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

## MASTERS MATES.

Blue Cloth Coat, edged with White; no Lappels; Blue round Cuff, with Three Buttons, and Three to the Pocket; fall-down Collar; White Lining; Buttons same as Warrant Officers:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

## MIDSHIPMEN.

Blue Cloth Coat, no Lapels, Blue round Cuff, with Three Buttons, and Three to the Pocket; ft.n.i.

stand-up Collar, with small White Turnback as before; White Lining, but not edged; Buttons same as Warrant Officers:—White Cloth Waistcoat and Breeches.

**A** Mail will be made up at this Office for the West-Indies on Wednesday next the 21st Instant, being the Third Wednesday in the Month.

The Course of the Packets will be for Barbadoes, St. Vincent's, Grenada, St. Kitt's and Jamaica, where, instead of being detained to receive Answers to the Letters from the internal Parts of the Island, they will stay but Forty-eight Hours, and then return by the Windward Passage to England, and the next Packet will take up the Answers to the Letters delivered by the First.

All Letters for the Leeward Islands will be conveyed from Barbadoes by a Brig to Dominica and Antigua, at each of which Islands she will take up the Letters for Great Britain and Ireland, as well as for Jamaica, and proceed to St. Kitt's, where she will deliver them to be forwarded by the English Packet, upon her Arrival from Grenada.

This is a temporary Plan, till another upon a larger Scale can be carried into Effect.

**I**N Pursuance of the Statute made in the Nineteenth Year of King George the Second, intituled, "An Act for the further Punishment of Persons going armed or disguised, in Defence of the Laws of Customs or Excise, and for indemnifying Offenders against those Laws upon the Terms in this Act mentioned, and for the Relief of Officers of the Customs on Informations upon Seizures;" and also in pursuance of the Statute of the Eighth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, thereby referred to, intituled, "An Act for the Amendment of the Law relating to Actions on the Statute of Hue and Cry," John Gift, of Ottery Saint Mary, in the County of Devon, Officer of Excise, hereby gives Notice, That on Saturday the 31 Day of this instant November, he the said John Gift, together with William Scott, Supernumerary Officer of Excise, and William Jenkins, of Honiton in the said County, Officer of Excise, being in Search of Smugglers, about One o'Clock in the Morning, came up with Two Smugglers mounted on Horses, with Casks or Kegs under them, near and within about Thirty Land Yards of a Turnpike Gate, called Runcombe's Gate, within or near the Parish of Sidbury and Hundred of East Budleigh, in the said County, or within or near the Parish of Farway and Hundred of Colyton, otherwise Cullston, in the same County, or One of them; and they the said Officers demanding the Casks, Two of them were thrown on the Ground, which they the said Officers seized, and One of them tasting the Liquor in One of the Casks, declared it was Brandy, and thereupon they the said Officers demanded the Horses; and at that Time Four other Horsemen, also appearing to be Smugglers, with Casks under them, came to the Assistance of the other Two, and then they refused to let the said Officers have either the Horses or Liquor; whereupon a Scuffle began at or within a few Yards of the Spot where the said Officers came up with the said Smugglers and seized the said Two Casks as aforesaid, between the said Officers and the said Six Smugglers; and they endeavouring to take from the said Officers the said Casks which were seized, and to prevent the said Officers from doing their Duty, they drew their Cutlasses, to protect the Goods they had seized and their Persons; upon which an Attack was made on them by the said Smugglers, from One of whom the said John Gift first received a violent Blow on his Head, and then the Engagement became general between the said Officers and the said Smugglers, during which a Pistol was discharged by One of the said Smugglers, and all of them had large Sticks or Bludgeons, or large Whips; and during the Engagement the said Smugglers threw large and heavy Stones at the said Officers: That in the said Affray or Engagement the said John Gift received from the said Smugglers many violent Blows and Bruises on many Parts of his Body and Head, and also several Cuts or Wounds in his Head, One of which was near Four Inches long; and the said Jenkins and Scott received several mortal Bruises and Wounds, whereof they died. And the said John Gift further gives Notice, That the Name of One of the said Smugglers was called William Voysey, who lives at Cullumpton in the said County, and that he is about Five Feet Seven or Eight Inches high, rather set grown, of a ruddy Complexion, dark Hair, and had on a Surtout Coat; that another of the said Smugglers was a Person from whom the said John Gift had on the Monday preceding that Day seized a Horse and One Cask of Brandy, and Two Casks of Geneva, but whose Name the said John Gift doth not know; that at the Time of the Affray the said John Gift called him Marsh, to which he made Answer, and said his Name was John Marsh, but the said John Gift hath since been informed his Name is not Marsh; that he is a Man about Five Feet Nine Inches, comely Person, wears his own Hair, and on Friday the 2d of November instant in the Afternoon, he had on a light-coloured Surtout Coat, with a Smock Frock under it, rode a handsome Grey Horse with a long Tail; and that the said John Gift has since been informed that he lives at or near Beer in the said County of Devon; and the said John Gift is certain, should he see him again by Day, he should be able to swear to his Person; and doth declare that the said Four other Smugglers appeared to him to be strong, active Men, but he cannot give any particular Description of their Persons or Dresses, but has also been informed, and verily believes, that Two of these Four were called Salter, a Father and Son, and that they live or belong to Kentis Beer in the said County: That the Father is called William, and the Son Peter; and that they were both much wounded and cut; and that some Time of the said Saturday the 3d Instant they were at Cullumpton or Kentis Beer, or that Neighbourhood, and had their Wounds dressed by a Surgeon for Cullumpton; and from the Information, and the Circumstances, the said John Gift suspected the said William and Peter Salter to be Two of the said Offenders, but does not know it.
