**Sea Officers Widows Pensions.**

THESE are to give Notice, That the Widows of His Majesty's Commission and Warrant Officers of His Majesty's Navy will be paid their Pensions due the 31st of May last, at the House of Thomas Gilbert, Esq; Pay-Master of the said Pensions, in Queen-street, Westminster, viz. the Widows of Captains, Lieutenants and Masters, on Thursday the 29th of this instant November; The Widows of Boatswains and Gunners, on Friday the 30th Instant; and the Widows of Carpenters, Purser and Surgeons, on Saturday the 1st of December, between the Hours of Ten and Two, and every Thursday afterwards, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve.

In order to discourage and deter any Women who may endeavour to defraud the Charity, under Pretence of being the Widows of Officers, or within the Circumstances required, when they are not really so, the Governors have thought fit to order a Reward of Fifty per Cent. upon what shall be saved by the Detection of such Frauds; which Reward shall be paid to any Person who shall discover and detect the same.
