WHEREAS on the 31st of January last, a Boat belonging to His Majesty's Ship, the *Druid*, commanded by Captain Ellijon, fell in with and took, in Cawsand Bay within the Limits of the Port of Plymouth, a Smuggling Luggier called the *Re-venge*, belonging to Guernsey, whereof Henry Carter was Master, with a Cargo of Spirituous Liquors in Ankers; and other prohibited Goods, but that previous to the Boat's boarding the Luggier, she was fired into by the Smugglers, whereupon an Action commenced, and in the Course of it One of the *Druid's* Crew was killed and Seven others wounded; after which the Master and Ten of the Crew belonging to the said Luggier made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Outrage and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders (except the Master of the said Luggier) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any Two or more of those, who so made their Escape as aforesaid, may be apprehended and convicted.
