WHEREAS on the 31st of January last, a Boat belonging to His Majesty's Ship the Druid, commanded by Captain Ellison, fell in with and took, in Cawfand Bay within the Limits of the Port of Plymouth, a Smuggling Lugger called the Rewenge, belonging to Guernsey, whereof Henry Carter was Master, with a Cargo of Spirituous Liquors in Ankers, and other prohibited Goods, but that previous to the Boat's boarding the Lugger, she was fired into by the Smugglers, whereupon an Action commenced, and in the Course of it One of the Druid's Crew was killed and Seven others wounded; after which the Master and Ten of the Crew belonging to the faid Lugger made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Outrage and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Jaid Offenders (except the Master of the said Lugger) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any Two or more of those, who so made their Escape as aforesaid, may be

apprehended and convicted.
