In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout the City.

WHEREAS on the 31st of January last, a Boat belonging to His Majesty's Ship the *Druid*, commanded by Captain Ellison, fell in with and took, in Carlsand Bay within the Limits of the Port of Plymouth, a Smuggling Lugger called the *Revenge*, belonging to Guernsey, whereof Henry Carter was Master, with a Cargo of Spirituous Liquors in Ankers, and other prohibited Goods, but that previous to the Boat's boarding the Lugger, she was fired into by the Smugglers, whereupon an Action commenced, and in the Course of it One of the *Druid's* Crew was killed and Seven others wounded; after which the Master and Ten of the Crew belonging to the said Lugger made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this Outrage and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders (except the Master of the said Lugger) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices, so that any Two or more of those, who so made their Escape as aforesaid, may be apprehended and convicted.

A B U R G L A R Y.

WHEREAS the Mansion-House of Sir William Yea, Bart. of Pyrland, near Taunton in the County of Somerset, was broke and entered in the Night of the 8th Day of this instant February, by Two Ruffians armed and disguised, who violently assaulted and beat the said Sir William Yea and Mr. George Yea his Son, with Intent to murder them, and rob and plunder the said House: Since which it has been discovered that the Persons who committed the Burglary and Assault aforesaid are John Stone the Younger, late of Brompton Ralph, in the said County, Carpenter and Cordwainer, and a Ruffian who came down with him from London to Taunton, on Saturday the 2d Instant, and appeared to be between Thirty and Forty Years of Age, about Six Feet in Height, a very lusty strong made Man, Brown or Flaxen Hair, Carrotty Beard, Ruddy Complexion, marked on the Right Cheek resembling a large Mole, stoops his Head a little, rather round shouldered, wore down a Blue Coat worn out under the Arms, Scarlet Waistcoat, Leather Breeches, and an old greasy Hat, narrow in the Brim and bound round the Edge; spoke the Scotch Dialect, and produced a Discharge from the Artillery, dated the 13d Day of January last, stating his Height to be Five Feet Ten Inches and an Half, his Age Twenty-seven, and by Trade a Slater; but it is rather suspected that such Discharge was forged to elude Detection.

Stone is about Thirty-four Years of Age, a young Look, about Six Feet in Height, a lusty well-grown Man, fair Complexion, handsome Features, dark Brown Hair, Carrotty Beard, Hazel Eyes, Broad Thumbs and Short Nails, stoops his Head a little, full at the Ancles, and Legs large at the Small.
