LETTERS from Gratz, in Styria, advise that the Emperor arrived there in the Forenoon of Saturday last, and that, after having taken a View of the new public Works carrying on there, his Imperial Majesty set out for Laubach on Sunday Morning.

Prince Charles Lichtenstein, General of Cavalry, and Governor of this City, set out Yesterday for the Army in Hungary. The Command of the Troops in Lower Austria devolves on Lieutenant-General Terzy.

Hague, March 10.

The Anniversary of the Birth of His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, Hereditary Stadtholder, &c. was celebrated on Saturday last, in this Residence, with great Rejoicings and Magnificence, on which Occasion his Serene Highness received the Congratulations of the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction at his Palace. In the Evening there was a Drawing-Room at the Palace called the Old Court, where that Prince, together with her Royal Highness the Princess of Orange, received the Compliments of a very numerous and brilliant Assembly. The Illuminations and other Demonstrations of Joy in Honour of the Day were general throughout the Town.

Hague, March 14.

His Excellency Sir James Harris, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from His Britannick Majesty to their High Mightinesses, having notified his Appointment to be His Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, had a Conference Yesterday with the President of the Assembly of their High Mightinesses, to whom he presented his new Credentials.

And this Day his Excellency paid a Visit of Ceremony, as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain, to the Prince of Orange. His Serene Highness has fixed on To-morrow, to return his Excellency's Visit in the usual Form.

Plan which has been recently adopted for dispatching the Packets to the West Indies, and will be carried into Effect till further Notice.

A Mail will be made up at this Office on the first Wednesday of every Month for Jamaica, and also for the Leeward Islands, with which a Packet will be dispatched immediately from Falmouth to touch at Barbadoes on her Outward Bound Passage, and leave there the Letters for all the Leeward Islands, and then proceed directly to Jamaica, from whence she is to return, after staying Fourteen Days, and no more, by the Windward Passage to England.

Another Mail will be made up for the Leeward Islands on the Third Wednesday in every Month, with which a Packet will proceed, first to Barbadoes, and from thence to St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Kitt's and Tortola, and, after having staid no longer than Forty-eight Hours at Barbadoes, St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua and St. Kitt's, and Twenty-four Hours at each of the other Islands, she is to return directly to England with the Letters she may have collected for Great Britain and Ireland.
