The Anniversary of the Birth of His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, Hereditary Stadtholder, &c. was celebrated on Saturday last, in this Residence, with great Rejoicings and Magnisscence, on which Occasion his Serene Highness received the Congratulations of the Foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction at his Palace. In the Evening there was a Drawing-Room at the Palace called the Old Court, where that Princes of Orange, received the Royal Highness the Princess of Orange, received the Compliments of a very numerous and brilliant Assembly. The Illuminations and other Demonstrations of Joy in Honour of the Day were general throughout the Town.
