# A PROCLAMATION,

For recalling and probibiting Seamen from ferving Foreign Princes and States.

#### GEORGE R.

HEREAS it hath been reprefented unto Us, That Attempts are made to entice Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our Natural-born Subjects, to enter

into the Service of Foreign Princes and States, contrary to their Duty to Us, and without Regard to the perfect Amity now fubfifting between Us and all the other Powers of Europe; We have therefore thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby firiftly charge and command all Mafters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men, whatfoever and wherefo-ever (being Our Natural-born Subjects,) who may have entered into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, without Our Special Licence and Authority in that Behalf heretofore obtained, that forthwith they and every of them do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw them-felves, depart from and quit fuch Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries : And further, We do hereby firicily prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatloever (being Our Natural-born Subjects,) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth to forbear to enter themselves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedience and exact Conformity: And We do hereby publish and declare, That the Offenders to the con-trary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Output Dupleante, but be utmost Severities of the Law : And We do hereby de-clare, That if any such Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men (being Our Subjects,) shall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any

others, they fuall not be reclaimed by Us as Subjects of Great Britain.

A Mail will be made np at this Office on the first Wednesday of every Month for Jamaica, and also for the Leeward Islands, with which a Packet will be dispatched immediately from Falmouth to touch at Barbadoes on her Outward Bound Passage, and leave there the Letters for all the Leeward Islands, and then proceed directly to Jamaica, from whence she is to return, after staying Fourteen Days, and no more, by the Windward Passage to England. Another Mail will be made up for the Leeward

Another Mail will be made up for the Leeward Islands on the Third Wednesday in every Month, with which a Packet will proceed, first to Barbadoes, and from thence to St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua, Montferrat, Newis, St. Kitt's and Tortola, and, after baving staid no longer than Forty-eight Heurs at Barbadoes, St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua and St. Kitt's, and Twenty-four Hours at each of the other Islands, she is to return directly to England with the Letters she may have collected for Great Britain and Ireland.
