Chapter of the Moft Noble Order of the Garter having been fummoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, with the Officers of the Order hereafter mentioned, all in their Mantles, the Knights (with their Collars) attended the Sovereign in His own Apartment, and being called over by Garter, a Procession was made from thence to the Great Council Chamber in the following Order:

> Marquis of Stafford. Earl of Hertford.

Duke of Montagu.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland.

His Royal Highness the Duke of York.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

Black Rod. The Chancellor. Garter King of Arms. The Prelate.

# The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, the Chancellor acquainted His Majefly that the Bithop of Carlifle, Dean of Windfor, attended at the Door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the Oath of Register of this Moth Noble Order; whereupon being in his Mantle (over his Epifcopal Habit) he was conducted to the Sovereign by Garter and Black Rod, the latter carrying the Infignia of the Register's Office on a Velvet Cushion; and the Bishop kneeling down near the Sovereign, the Oath was administered to him by the Chancellor; which being done, Black Rod kneeling prefented to the Sovereign the Gold Chain and Badge, which His Majefly was pleafed to put over the Regifter's Neck, who, having kiffed His Majefly's Hand, withdrew to his Place.

The Chancellor then fignified to the Chapter, the Sovereign's Pleafure for filling up the Two Vacant Stalls; and as, by the Statutes, none but a Knight can be elected, Garter and Black Rod were fent to introduce his Grace the Duke of Dorfet, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State.

Then his Grace the Duke of Northumberland was

introduced and knighted with the like Ceremonies. The Knights Companions proceeded to the Election, and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and prefented to the Sovereign, his Grace the Duke of Dorfet was, by His Majefly's Command, declared duly elected. His Grace was thereupon received duly elected. His Grace was thereupon received at

the Door of the Chapter Room by the Two Junior Knights, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter (bearing the Enfigns on a Cufhion) and Black Rod.

Garter presenting the Garter to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered it to the Two Senior Knights, who buckled it upon on his Grace's Leg, the Chancellor reading the Admonition.

Garter then prefented the Ribbon with the George to the Sovereign, and his Grace kneeling down, the Sovereign, with the Affiftance of the Two Senior Knights, put it over his Shoulder, the Chancellor in the mean Time pronouncing the Admonition; and the Duke having killed his Majefty's Hand, and feverally faluted all the Knights prefent, withdrew.

The Chapter proceeded to a Second Election, and the Suffrages being collected as before, the Duke of Northumberland was, by His Majeffy's Command, declared duly elected, and his Grace was introduced and invefted with the Garter, Ribbon and George in the fame Manner as the Duke of Dorfet had been ; and the like Formalities having been obferved, he withdrew.

Garter then calling over the Knights, a Proceffion was made back to His Majefty's Apartment in the Order as before, except that the Register walked in his Place between Garter and Black Rod.

IN Compliance with the unanimous Request of a Meeting of West India Merchants in the City of London, the following Alteration will be made in the Plan which has been recently adopted for difpatching the Packets to the Weft Indies, and will be carried into Effect till further Notice.

A Mail will be made up at this Office on the first Wednesday of every Month for Jamaica, and also for the Leeward Islands, with which a Packet will be difpatched immediately from Falmouth to touch at Barbadoes on her Outward Bound Paffage, and leave baaees on her Outward Bound Pajage, and teave there the Letters for all the Leeward Islands, and then proceed directly to Jamaica, from whence she is to re-turn, after staying Fourteen Days, and no more, by the Windward Passage to England. Another Mail will be made up for the Leeward Islands on the Third Wednesday in every Month, with

which a Packet will proceed, first to Barbadoes, and from thence to St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua, Montferrat, Nevis, St. Kitt's and Tortola, and, after having staid no longer than Forty-eight Hours at Barbadoes, St. Vincent's, Grenada, Dominica, Antigua and St. Kitt's, and Twenty-four Hours at each of the other Islands, the is to return directly to England with the Letters the may have collected for Great Britain and Ireland
