

**W**hereas I Thomas Audern, of Digley, in the County of Chester, Butcher, on the 13th of September, 1786, did obtain a Warrant against Abraham Hampson, of Mellor, in the County of Derby, from Robert Wright, Esq; one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said County of Derby, by making Oath, That on Friday the 8th of the same Month of September, one Piece of Oak Timber, Fifty Feet Measure, was feloniously stolen, taken and carried away from the Liberty of Marple, and that I had just Cause to suspect, and did suspect that the said Abraham Hampson had feloniously stolen, taken and carried away the same: And whereas the said Abraham Hampson did, in Hilary Term last, commence and prosecute to Judgment an Action against me in the King's Bench for maliciously laying a groundless Charge before the said Justice against him, but hath agreed to stop all further Proceedings against me on my paying the Costs of Suit, asking his Pardon and declaring that I now believe I had no proper Foundation for laying such Charge against him, which I hereby do; and do also consent and agree that this my Declaration be inserted once at my own Expence in the London Gazette; as witness my Hand the 27th Day of October, 1787.
