An Act for raifing further Sums of Money for the better Relief of the Poor of the City and County of the City of Exon, and to explain and amend an Act passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for rendering more effectual several Ass of Parliament for creeting Hospitals and Work-bouses within the Said City and County for the better employing and maintaining the Poor there.

In like Manner Vice-Admiral Hood was afterwards introduced into the Presence, knighted, and invested with the Ribbon and Badge of the Order; and having likewise kissed His Majesty's Hand, the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber, in the Order above mentioned.

The Ceremony was performed in His Majesty's Closet, several Great Officers of the Court being present.

This Morning one of His Majesty's Messengers arrived at the Office of the Marquis of Carmarthen, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, with the Ratification, on the Part of the States General of the United Provinces, of the Treaty of Defensive Alliance figned at the Hague the 15th of April last, which was exchanged there on the 8th Instant with his Excellency Sir James Harris, Knight of the Bath, His Majesty's Ambasfador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to their High Mightinesses, against His Majesty's Ratification, by the Deputies of the States General.
