Packets to and from France.

TWO new and commodious Packets for Goods and Passengers, elegantly fitted up and well manned, sail every Tuesday and Friday from Gosport (in Portsmouth Harbour) to Havre de Grace, which is the best French Harbour in the Chanel, and the Sea-Port of Paris, Rouen, &c. and from Havre de Grace to Gosport every Tuesday and Saturday.
