

then installed, singly or with their Companions, were conducted by Two Heralds to the Altar, as at the first Offering, where each Knight standing and drawing his Sword, presented it to the Dean, who received it, and laid it on the Altar. The Knight then redeemed it of the Dean, who restored it with the proper Admonition, according to the Oath; which done, they returned under their Banners.

Mr. *Handel's* Coronation Anthem, GOD SAVE THE KING, being sung, and the Ceremony concluded, a Procession was made back to the Prince's Chamber in the same Order it came from thence,

except that the Sub-Dean and Prebendaries retired to the Jerusalem Chamber from the Abbey-Door, and the Esquires, the Officers of Arms, and the Officers of the Order, when they came out of the Church, were covered.

Within the Door of the Abbey, the King's Master Cook made the usual Admonition to each Companion.

At the Door of the Prince's Chamber, a Person was appointed by Bath King of Arms to receive the Mantle from the Proxy.
