On Wednesday last her Imperial Highness the Great Dutchess was safely delivered of a Princess at Czarico-Zelo.

Vienna, June 4.

The Prince of Saxe-Cobourg, after bombarding Chotzim, has withdrawn his Troops from before that Town, and retired to the Fort of Okoppi, within the Austrian Frontier.

Letters from Semlin, of the 29th of May, mention, that the Army destined for the Attack of Belgrade had not then passed the Save, but remained nearly in its former Position.
