Waples, April 7. Y & Feluccaarrived from Sicily, we underderfland, that the Prince of Gonzague, Viceroy of that Kingdom, who continues fill at Meffina, endcavors all he can, by his mild proceedings, to reflore in thole people their affection, as well as obedience to the Crown of Spaint in which he hath had a good fucce's, and feveral perfons, of those that field upon the French abandoning that Country, are returned, and live there with the fame liberty and fatisfaction as formerly; and when this first work is done; of fetling things at home; the faid Viceroy will in the next place apply himfelf to reinforce the Kings Army in Cata-Jonia with fuch Troops as can be fipared in Sicily. Our Viceroy the Marquis de los Velez, has already given orders for two of three Regiments to be transfoorted to Barcelond,

Aranported to barcetona, Madrid, April 13. The Fleet for the Indies will part from Cadiz the beginning of Juy. The Dutch Squadron commanded by the Sieur Evertzen, that's arrived there, will, as is faid, continue there, till such time as farther orders come from Holland. Don Huan is treating with the most eminent Merehants here, about remitting Monies to Flanders, which we understand by the Letters we receive from thence, is very much wanted there, in order to the making those preparations that are absolutely necessary. According to the Advices we receive from Gmilantinople, there is realon to believe, that the Turks make difficulty to Ratific the Treaty concluded between them and the Poles, till ficht time as they fee what likelihedd there is of theif Being able to accommodate matt ters with the Molfcovites; in which, if they do fucceed, it's thought they will make advantage of it to the pre-udice of the Poles! The laft account we had from the Duke of Lorrain, was of his arrival at Eflingen, where he had held a great Council of War with the principal Officers of the Army.

The vexations of the Munfter Troops, occasion great complaints among the Country people, and that not without reason; we hops they will now march in few days 3-the Officers give out they will. The Imperial Troops begin to draw together near Strasboarg, and, it feens, that City has obtained, that they may for the future quietly enjoy their Neutrality; and therefore the Duke of Lorrain has given orders for the laying a Bridge over the Rbine below Strasboarg. The more the defigit of the Imperialifs appears to befiege Friburg, the more diligent the French are to ftnilh the Fortifications they are making there, which are already in a flate of defence, and to furfill the place with men, and all things n. ceffary. It is faid, that the Troops of the Circles, affilted by fome of the Emperors Troops, will make the Siege, while the main Army, commanded by the Duke of Lorrain, will pals the Rbine, and give the Enemy other Entertainment.

Cólogne, May 3. On Sunday last the Marquis de Grana came hither, and the next day had a Conference with the Ministers of the Confederate Princes that arehere, about forming a Body of Men on the Meuse, to keep in the Gariton of Maesfiricht, of to be employed upon other occasions as may offer. I his day the faid Marquis de Grana parted from hence for Nimeguen, from whence we are told he will pass into England. The Advices we have from Surdsburg are, that all their, Neighborhood was full of Imperial Troops, who were quartered in the Villages, where they will continue till the fourth. or fifth instant; that Colonel Halweit was possed with a Body of Men near Offenburg, and that the Imperial Troops are on their march from all parts.

Bruffels, May 10. All the Spanish Officers who were taken in Leeuwe are come hither, having been fet at liberty upon their Paróle, either to return, or pay their Ranfoms: The account we have from them, as allo from the Lieutenant Governor of the Cittadel, is near the fame as was related in our laft. His Highnefs thePrince of Orange was fo much concerned at the loss of this place, that he refolved to march forthwith, if pollible to recover it, before the French fhould reinforce it with Men, Magazines, and Provifions, it having been in great want of every thing when it was taken ; and accordingly his Highneis did fend Major General Webbenum with 4500 Horfe and Dragoons to take Poft at St. Tron, to prevent any Convoy entring from Maeftricht, whilft another detachement of his Highnefles Army, hath taken Poft at Tirlemont, to prevent any fupply going in from Charlesoy; fo that the place is by this time invested, and his Highnefs is this day marched with his whole Army towards it; about 100 Wagons, laden with Provisions and Ammunition, with 6 Demy-Cannon, are gone this day from hence to meet his Highnels at Louvain, who has with him a very confiderable Train of Artillery. On Saturday night Monfielt DickFeild returned lither, accompanied with Mon-ficur Borger, deputed from the States General to his Excellency, who had Audience on Sunday morning, and the fame day after Dinner, returned to his Highneffe

neffes quarter to make a report of what had paffed (laff night, they both came back with his Highnes's refolutions, which they immediately imparted to his Excellency. Last night Monsieur Hoeg, the Danish Ambalfador and Plenipotentiary at Nimeguen, arrived here from the Hague', he intended to have a pub-lick Audience this day, but his Excellencies indifpofition has hindred it till to morrow. Don Bernardo de Sa'inas, is appointed by his Excellency to command in the Caule of Antwerp, pro interim, till his Catholick Majefty hath nominated a Succeffor to Count Salazar, who died laft week. Thisday Count Egmond began his journy towards England. He will flay two or three days at Antwerp.

**P**, S. Juft now we receive advice, that the Dutch Troops which were marching towards Leeuwe, are countermanded, and that the refolution of befieging that place, is changed, upon a difficulty made by the Lunenburg Troops to march till they had re-ceived Monies. The Prince of Orange is gone to the Hague.

Hague, May 10. The dispositions towards a Peace appear here every day more and more; the States were affembled on this subject on Monday last, and, · it's faid, they come to a very important refolution. His Highness the Prince of Orange is gone from Breda to the Army, from whence his Highnels is expected back here in few days. . The Sieur Boreel is arrived on the part of this State at Bruffels, and has had Audience of the Duke de Villa Hermofa on the

fubject of his Erran d. Marfeilles, May 3. The Gallies which were want-ing, are now all fafe in this Port, and orders are come hither to have them all ready to go Sea again by the end of the next month. It is faid they are to be employed upon the Coaft of Catalonia. or three days fince the Sicur dn Luefne (ailed from Thoulon with ten Men of War under his command, upon what defign we know not. By a Vellel arrived here we have advice, that Sir *fohn Narborough* was with a confiderable Squadron of Men of War before Argiers.

Paru, May 7. The King has declared his refolution to part from St. Germains the 12 instant for Flanders; the Army which his Majefly will command there in perfon, is appointed to Rendezvous in the Neighborhood of Courtray. The Guards du Corps, the Genfdarm s, and the Light-horfe of the Guards, have orders to march towards *Lorrain*; and all the Officers as well belonging to the Troops in Germany, as in Flanders, are required to repair immediately to their respective Commands.
