**T**HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

*An Act for repealing the Duties on Buck or Deer Skins undressed, Buck or Deer Skins Indian half dressed, and Elk Skins undressed, imported, and on Hides and Skins dressed in Oil in this Kingdom, and for granting other Duties in Lieu thereof; for laying a Duty on Stuffs printed, painted, stained or dyed in Great Britain; allowing Deer and other Skins, the Produce of Florida, to be sold by Auction, free from the Duty charged on such Sales; for amending several Laws relative to the Revenue of Excise, and to prevent the Sale of Sweets for Consumption in the Houses of Retailers thereof, who shall not have Licences to sell Beer or Ale.*

*An Act to allow the Importation of Rum or other Spirits from His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in the West Indies into the Province of Quebec, without Payment of Duty, under certain Conditions and Restrictions.*

*An Act to explain, amend and reduce into one Act of Parliament several Laws now in being for preventing the Exportation of live Sheep, Rams and Lambs Wool, Woolfells, Morlings, Shortlings, Yarn and Worsted Crewels, Coverlids, Waddings and other Manufactures, or pretended Manufactures, made of Wool slightly wrought up, or otherwise put together, so as the same may be reduced to and made Use of as Wool again, Mattresses or Beds stuffed with combed Wool or Wool fit for combing, Fullers Earth, Fulling Clay, and Tobacco Pipe Clay, from this Kingdom, and from the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, into Foreign Parts; and for rendering more effectual an Act passed in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of King Henry the Eighth, intituled, An Act for the Winding of Wool.*

*An Act for the better securing the Rights of Persons qualified to vote at County Elections.*

*An Act for appointing Commissioners further to enquire into the Losses and Services of all such Persons who have suffered in their Rights, Properties and Professions during the late unhappy Dissentions in America; in consequence of their Loyalty to His Majesty, and Attachment to the British Government.*

*An Act for limiting the Number of Persons to be carried on the Outside of Stage Coaches, or other Carriages:*

*An Act for the better and more effectual Protection of Stocking Frames, and the Machines or Engines annexed thereto, or used therewith, and for the Punishment of Persons destroying or injuring of such Stocking Frames, Machines or Engines, and the Framework-knitted Pieces, Stockings, or other Articles and Goods used and made in the Hosiery and Framework-knitted Manufactory, or breaking or destroying any Machinery contained in any Mill or Mills used or any way employed in preparing or spinning of Wool or Cotton for the Use of the Stocking Frame.*

*An Act for the better Regulation of Chimney Sweepers and their Apprentices.*

*An Act for dividing and inclosing the Marsh called Malldraeth and Corfdaugan, in the County of Anglesey, and for embanking the said Marsh; and for making Cuts, Channels and other Works for draining and preserving the same; and for allowing the free Use of such Cuts or Channels with Boats or other Vessels, upon the Payment of certain Rates, to be applied towards supporting the said Embankments and Works.*

**W**HEREAS an Act has been passed in this present Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act to continue the Laws now in Force for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, so far as the same relate to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants of the Countries belonging to the said United States:" And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that there is Reason to apprehend that Wheat, the Produce of various Parts of the Territories belonging to the said United States of America, may be infected with an Insect, the spreading of which would be

be injurious to the Grain of this Kingdom; His Majesty, taking the same into His Royal Consideration, is hereby pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that the utmost Care be taken not to permit any Entry to be passed for Wheat of the Growth of any of the Territories belonging to the said United States of America, which is already or may hereafter be brought into any of the Ports of Great Britain, until His Majesty's Pleasure shall be further signified:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

Peterburgh, June 3.

On Sunday last the new-born Princess was christened at the Empress's Chapel at Czarsko-Zelo by the Name of Catherine; and after the Ceremony invested by her Imperial Majesty with the Ensigns of the Order of St. Catherine. The Empress has also conferred on Count Solikow, Governor to their

Imperial Highnesses the Young Great Dukes, the Order of the First Class of St. Volodimer, and has distinguished several other Persons, both in the Civil and Military Line, with particular Marks of Honour.

By Letters from Field Marshal Count Wartenleben, of the 4th Infant, it appears that a Detachment of his Army had intercepted a Turkish Convoy of Provisions intended for Belgrade, and destroyed what they could not carry off.

The last Accounts from Semlin contain nothing interesting.

Turin, June 7.

The Vicomte de la Herreria, late Spanish Ambassador at this Court, has presented his Letters of Recal, and is succeeded by the Count de Guemes, who has presented his Credentials in the same Character.

Vienna, June 14.

Advices of the 3d Instant from Prince Lichtenstein mention that a Body of Turks, consisting of 3000 Men, Horse and Foot, in Three Divisions, made an Attempt on the Austrian Lines, extending from the Right Side of the Glina to the Redoubt of Szaro Szello. As soon as the advanced Posts perceived the Enemy marching in superior Force, they gave the Alarm, and retired under the Fort, the Fire of which soon obliged the Turks to disperse. A Party then attempted to pass the Glina, and attacked the Austrians posted at the Bridge at Kattinovac, but met with so vigorous a Resistance, that after returning Three Times to the Assault, they were repulsed with Loss. This Party afterwards rejoined the main Body, and returned to the Charge in greater Numbers, but with no better Effect, finding a braver Resistance from a Detachment of the Regiment of Szluiner, under the Command of Major Knefevich, and from a Company of the First Regiment of the Frontiers, who at length put the Turks to Flight, and pursued them into their own Lines.

The Enemy left behind them 34 dead, with the Standard-Bearer, and several Horses. They threw about 40 Men into the River, and carried with them besides a considerable Number of killed and wounded. Our Loss amounts to Two Officers and 40 Men killed, and Four wounded.

His Prussian Majesty having paid a Visit to the Prince and Princess of Orange at Loo, where he arrived on the 11th Instant, and set out from thence the 13th at Midnight, returned to Charlottenburgh in perfect Health the 16th in the Evening.
