By Letters received Yesterday from Bohopol, on the Bog, of the 5th Instant, we learn, that the Army, under the Command of the Marshal Prince Potem-

between Ingul and Olwiopol there were near 70,000 Men under Arms, exclusive of Eight Regiments of Coffacks of the Don, and some other Detachments. That the Field Artillery confisted of 127 Pieces, from 12 to 24 Pounders. That on the 1st Instant 2430 Waggons, with Biscuit, &c. arrived at Olwiopol from Kremenzuk. That from the 2d to the 5th Inftant, the 2d Division of the Russian Army, consisting of about 30,000 Men, commanded by Prince Repnin, had passed the Bog, and had taken Post on the Turkish Side of the River. That the First Division waited only the Arrival of Prince Potemkin from Elizabeth to do the same. That there is certain Advice of a Reinforcement of 40,000 Men, with a Quantity of Provisions and Ammunition, being arrived at Oczakow, by Sea; and that a Seraskier is in March, at the Head of 50,000 Men, to cover that Place by Land. In the mean Time Marshal Romanzow, with his Army, has passed the Dniester, at and in the Neighbourhood of Jampul.
