## • Office for Auditing the Public Accounts, Somerfet Place, July 12, 1788.

W HEREAS divers Perfons, to whom Money has been iffued for Public Sevices, have neglected to deliver into this Office the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, in the Manner, and within the Time prefcribed by the AS for better examining and Auditing the Public Accounts of this Kingdom, the Commissioners for Auditing the Public Accounts have directed that Copies of the following Sections of the faid ASt be inferted in the London Gazette, in order that all Perfons to whom Public Money has been, or shall be, fo isfued, may be informed of the Confequences of Juch Neglect.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Loffes and Inconveniences have arifen to the Public, by Sub-Accountants not having been put in Charge till a long Time has elapfed after the Monies were iffued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymafter-General of His Majefty's Forces, the Treafurer of the Navy, the Treafurer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who fhall hereafter pay into the Hands of any Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, Money for Public Services, by Way of Impreft or on Account, fhall, within Thirty Days of the 31ft Day of December, One thoufand feven hundred and eighty five, and within Thirty Days of the 31ft Day of December in every future Year, tranfmit an Account of all Sums of Money iffued or paid by him or them to any Perfon or Perfons, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commifioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who fhall, and they are hereby, required forthwith to tranfmit Duplicates of the fame to His Majefty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who fhall immediately, on Receipt of fuch Accounts, put the feveral Sums foi fifued in Charge againft the Parties, in like Manner as now practifed with refpect to Perfons who receive Money by Way of Impreft, and on Account, at the Receipt of His Majefty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII, Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant shall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he shall issue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unless he shall have transmitted to the faid Commissioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unless Proof shall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of the Treasfury, that any Failure of transmitting the same did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Person issues of the the satisfaction.

istuing or paying over the Money as aforefaid. SECTION XX. And be it further enacted and declared. That every Sub Accountant to whom Money shall hereafter be issued for Public Services, in case the Money fo issued that have been for Services to be performed in Great Britain, shall deliver into the Office of the Commissioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unlefs it has been usual for such Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Cafe they shall be delivered within Three Months of the usual Time of the Determination of each Account respectively; and in cafe such Monies shall have been issued for Services to be performed in any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then

the Vouchers shall be delivered within Four Months of the Expiration of each Year's Ac-counts; if in the Weft Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; and if in the East Indies, within Twelve Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; unless it shall in each and every Cafe be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Treasury, that the Failure of transmitting-the fame, within the Periods beforementioned, was unavoidable; in which Cafe fuch further Delay may be granted by Warrant under the Hands of the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three of them, as they shall judge reasonable; and in such Cases the Vouchers shall be delivered at the Expiration of the Term of Delay fo granted, on Pain, upon Failure in any of the abovementioned Cafes, of paying fuch Fine to His Majefty as the Court of Exchequer, on Application made to them, shall think fit to fet and impose; which Fine the faid Court is hereby authorized and impowered to fet and impose accordingly.

SECTION XXII. Provided always, and be it ehacted, that when any Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall transmit to the Commissioners, to be appointed under the Authority of this Act, a fufficient and fatisfactory Discharge from the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, the Commissioners for Victualling His Majesty's Navy, or the Commissioners for Sick and Hurt, for any Monies he or they shall have received in the faid Departments feverally, the faid Commissioners shall transmit **a** Duplicate of the fame to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall forthwith shall out the Name or Names of fuch Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall from thenceforth be discharged from any other or further Account for the fame.
