Cheltenham, July 25.

ON Thursday last the King, the Queen, and the Three Princesses, visited the City of Gloucester. Their Majesties and their Royal Highnesses alighted at the Bishop's Palace, who, attended by the Dean and Chapter of that Cathedral, and the Clergy of the Diocese, addressed the King on the Occasion, who was pleased to receive them very graciously, and they had also the Honour of being presented to the Queen. The Mayor and Corporation of Gloucester then attended, and the Town-Clerk addressed His Majesty in their Name. They were likewise presented to the Queen. Their Majesties afterwards visited the Cathedral, the Pin Manufactory of Mr. Alderman Weaver, the County Infirmary, and the Goal now building agreeably to a Plan of Sir George Paul and Mr. Howard. Their Majesties then returned to the Bishop's Palace, and as soon as their Equipages were ready, set out with the Princesses on their Return to this Place. The Concourfe of People in the Streets of Gloucester was immense; but from the Order that was observed through the Attention of the Magistrates, Their Majesties were not in the least incommoded.

Office for Auditing the Public Accounts,
Somerfet Place, July 12, 1788.

WHEREAS divers Persons, to whom Money has been issued for Public Services, have neglected to deliver into this Office the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, in the Manner, and within the Time prescribed by the Act for better examining and Auditing the Public Accounts of this Kingdom, the Commissioners for Auditing the Public Accounts have directed that Copies of the following Sections of the said Act be inserted in the London Gazette, in order that all Persons to whom Public Money has been, or shall be, so issued, may be informed of the Consequences of such Neglect.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Losses and Inconveniences have arisen to the Public, by Sub-Accountants not having been put in Charge till a long Time has elapsed after the Monies were issued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymaster-General

of His Majesty's Forces, the Treasurer of the Navy, the Treasurer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who shall hereafter pay into the Hands of any Person or Persons whomsoever, Money for Public Services, by Way of Imprest or on Account, shall, within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, and within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December in every future Year, transmit an Account of all Sums of Money issued or paid by him or them to any Person or Persons, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commissioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who shall, and they are hereby required forthwith to transmit Duplicates of the same to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall immediately, on Receipt of such Accounts, put the several Sums so issued in Charge against the Parties, in like Manner as now practised with respect to Persons who receive Money by Way of Imprest, and on Account, at the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant shall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he shall issue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unless he shall have transmitted to the said Commissioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unless Proof shall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of the Treasury, that any Failure of transmitting the same did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Person issuing or paying over the Money as aforesaid.

SECTION XX. And be it further enacted and declared, That every Sub-Accountant to whom Money shall hereafter be issued for Public Services, in case the Money so issued shall have been for Services to be performed in Great Britain, shall deliver into the Office of the Commissioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unless it has been usual for such Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Case they shall be delivered within Three Months of the usual annual Time of the Determination of each Account respectively; and in case such Monies shall have been issued for Services to be performed in any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then the Vouchers shall be delivered within Four Months of the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; if in the West Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after the

the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; and if in the East Indies, within Twelve Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; unless it shall in each and every Case be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of the Treasury, that the Failure of transmitting the same, within the Periods beforementioned, was unavoidable; in which Case such further Delay may be granted by Warrant under the Hands of the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three of them; as they shall judge reasonable; and in such Cases the Vouchers shall be delivered at the Expiration of the Term of Delay so granted, on Pain, upon Failure in any of the above-mentioned Cases, of paying such Fine to His Majesty as the Court of Exchequer, on Application made to them, shall think fit to set and impose; which Fine the said Court is hereby authorized and empowered to set and impose accordingly.

SECTION XXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, that when any Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall transmit to the Commissioners, to be appointed under the Authority of this Act, a sufficient and satisfactory Discharge from the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, the Commissioners for Victualling His Majesty's Navy, or the Commissioners for Sick and Hurt, for any Monies he or they shall have received in the said Departments severally, the said Commissioners shall transmit a Duplicate of the same to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall forthwith strike out the Name or Names of such Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants from the Imprest Roll; and such Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall from thenceforth be discharged from any other or further Account for the same.

APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, June 19, 1788.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof, upon Monies given, paid, or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in Relation, to every such Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, that upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies, or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, before the 25th Day of December next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture, or other Writing, shall be good and valid, and the Person so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.

IN pursuance of Notice given the 5th Instant, a Floating Light is placed near the Shoals called the Owers; off the Coast of Sussex; which will be constantly attended and kept burning from Sun-setting to Sun-rising, for the safe Guidance of Ships through that dangerous Part of the Channell: The Bearings and Marks as follow, viz.

BEARINGS.

Selsea Bill North West by North $\frac{1}{2}$ West, nearly $4\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant; the South End of Culver Cliff in the Isle of Wight, West $\frac{1}{2}$ South, $16\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant.

Dunnose Point, West South West $\frac{3}{4}$ West, $20\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant.

The Southmost Extremity of the Elbow of the Owers, which is the very Southmost Part of all the Shoals, South East by East, nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant.

The Eastborough Head, which is the East End nearly of all the Shoals, North East by East $\frac{1}{4}$ East, nearly $2\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant.

The Boulder Bank, which is the West End nearly of all the Shoals, West $\frac{1}{2}$ North, nearly $4\frac{1}{2}$ Miles distant.

The West End of the Shoal called the West Head, North East by East $\frac{1}{4}$ East, 616 Yards distant.

The East End of the Shoal called the Middle Ground, West South West $\frac{3}{4}$ West, 726 Yards distant; and the Swatch Way between these two last mentioned Shoals is nearly $\frac{1}{4}$ of a Mile wide, and the least Water in it from 5 to 6 Fathoms; the Light lies about Midway between the West End of the West Head, and the East End of the Middle Ground, in about 6 Fathoms the least Water; pretty clean Ground.

MARKS.

At the Owers Light the little Spire Church on Hayling Island, called Southwood Church, though more commonly Hayling Church, is apparently about Midway between the Middle and the South West Side of the remarkable large Chalk Pit on Portsdown-Hill, near Portsmouth, and bears North West $\frac{3}{4}$ West.

The other Mark is Selsea Church, about twice its apparent Length to the Westward of the White Way on

Bow-Hill, near Chichester, and bears North by West $\frac{1}{2}$ West.

N. B. All the Bearings expressed above are true Bearings, and not Magnetic. The Variation of the Compass is 23 Deg. 45 Min. West.
